

Board of Directors Regular Meeting

June 23, 2022

MEETING BRIEFING

The SODA Board of Directors met for its regular bi-monthly meeting on June 23, 2022 at Murray State College in Tishomingo, Oklahoma.

New Board Members

The City of Pauls Valley appointed Lee Litterell, Pauls Valley City Manager, as its representative to the SODA Board of Directors.

FY 2023 Annual Budget

The FY 2023 SODA annual budget was presented, reviewed and discussed by the Board of Directors. The FY 2023 budget estimates a cash surplus of \$4,435.06. The Board of Directors approved the FY 2023 budget with total estimated expenses in the amount of \$5,513,828.59; membership dues set at the same rate as previous years; indirect cost rate set at 30% of salary, wages and benefits (same as previous year); and a Capital Improvements-SODA Conference Center budget was approved in the amount of \$750,000.

Executive Director Steve Mills reported that SODA needs to explore ways to increase discretionary revenue sources to avoid budget deficits and sustain cash surpluses in future budgets. Two options are increasing membership dues and implementing a new fee-based service program.






SODA FY 2023 BUDGET IN BRIEF


