

Board of DirectorsRegular Meeting

October 28, 2022

MEETING BRIEFING

The SODA Board of Directors met for its regular bi-monthly meeting on October 28, 2022 at Murray State College in Tishomingo, Oklahoma.

New Board Members

- The City of Durant appointed Lisa Taylor, Davis City Manager, as its new representative to the SODA Board of Directors.
- The Love County Conservation District appointed Kit Dinwiddie, member of its Board of Directors, as its new representative to the SODA Board of Directors.
- The Garvin Conservation District appointed Mike Foster, member of its Board of Directors, as its new representative to the SODA Board of Directors

Election of New Secretary/Treasurer

Cacy Cribbs, Johnston County Commissioner, was elected as SODA Board of Directors Secretary/Treasurer to fill the vacancy in the Secretary/Treasurer office. Secretary/Treasurer Cribbs was also designated to be the Board of Directors signatory on SODA bank accounts.

2023 REAP Awards

The SODA Board of Directors approved \$2,709,952.16 in REAP grants to communities and counties in the SODA service area. Cities/towns and and other eligible entities such as volunteer fire departments in the SODA service were awarded \$1,639,015.79, county commissioners in the SODA service were awarded \$707,300.00, and a CDBG-REAP grant was awarded to the City of Healdton for \$363,636.37.

Managed Care/Case Management

The SODA Board of Directors approved submitting an application to the Oklahoma Medicaid Services Unit to become a provider for Advantage Case Management services. Establishing an Advantage Case Management program at SODA is still under review and would require additional action by the SODA Board of Directors to approve the program.

\$ODA Membership Dues Review

The SODA Board of Directors has not enacted a membership dues increase in decades. Membership dues enable long-term planning and allow SODA to invest in new or expanded programs and services for its members by providing financial leveraging capabilities. The current leveraging of the SODA core programs costs SODA \$75,000-\$90,000 annually and SODA collects about \$60,000 in membership dues. The Board of Directors reviewed a multi-year dues increase plan and will discuss and review different options at future meetings.


